




Franklin Delano Roosevelt (30 January 1882 – 12 April 1945), often referred to by his initials **FDR**, was an American statesman and political leader who served as the 32nd president of United States from 1933 until his death in 1945. A Democrat, he won a record four presidential elections and became a central figure in world events during the first half of the 20th century. As a dominant leader of his party, he built the New Deal Coalition, which realigned American politics into the Fifth Party System and defined American liberalism throughout the middle third of the 20th century. His third and fourth terms were dominated by World War II. He is often rated by scholars as one of the three greatest U.S. presidents, along with George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. In 1921, Roosevelt contracted a paralytic illness, unable to walk unaided. Roosevelt won re-election in 1944 but with his physical health declining during the war years, he died in April 1945, just 11 weeks into his fourth term.
