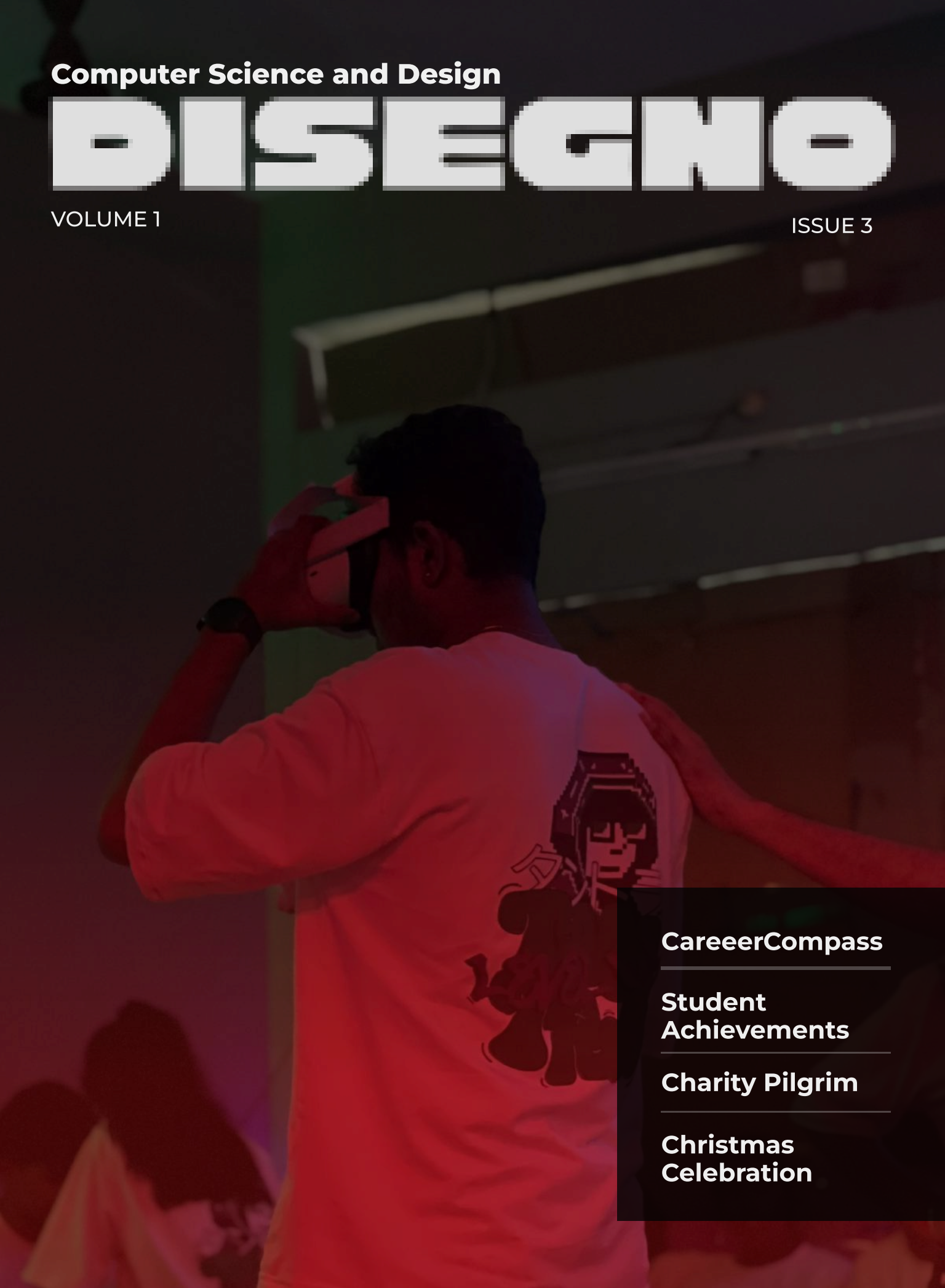

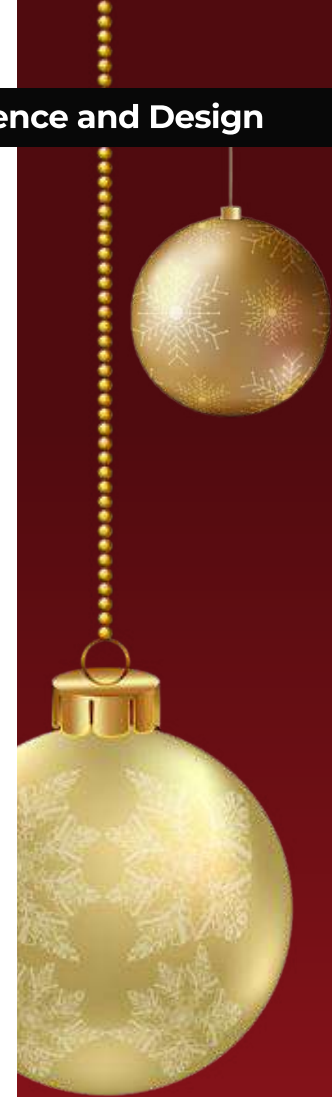
This experience was meant to inspire them to be more thoughtful, responsible, and kind toward everyone in the community, helping them to see the world through a more compassionate lens.
